A Message from Good Shepherd Center's Associate Executive Director



Happy New Year!!! I am saying that because we have wrapped up Fiscal Year 2023. As you may recall, our financial year in the state of Illinois runs from July 1st through June 30th. We have ended another successful year of serving children and families. Let me give you a few program highlights of what we accomplished this past fiscal year.

The Community Partner programs have provided well over 200 hundred trainings to support quality child care. We were excited to host more in person trainings since we have come back from the pandemic. We also completed a full second year as Community Partner in the Northern Cook-County suburbs. This proved to bring us many new connections with homes and centers who are now finding us and utilizing our services more readily. In June, we held our first conference (English only) we had 100 register and 70% in attendance- a great turn out for our first time doing an in-person conference.

As far as the South Suburban Community Partners, we continue to have a steady flow of providers coming to our virtual trainings, but are still working toward a better turn out for in person trainings. The biggest news from the South Partners is that our long time Bilingual Training Coordinator, Rosita Nardi, retired in June. Rosita had a long career of over 40 years of working in the Early Childhood field, where she mostly gave voice to Spanish Providers.

This coming year we will once again host our Strong Children Strong Communities Conference on February 24th at Moraine Valley Community College in Palos Hills.

Lastly, we ended the year with fulfilling our one-year grant for Early Childhood Recruitment Grant. This grant was designed to support Child Care with recruitment of staff and families. We did this through the development of a website, trainings that supported best business practice, and lots of outreach activities. The ECEC website gathered all providers who went through the business training in one centrally located place. The goal was to teach them the importance of learning new tools to be a better business leader. The website we developed became a one stop shop for clients to look for child care or, if you were a child care professional, you had acces to look for a job as programs posted open position on the website and other interesting information to promote their center or home.
